Business Aviation: what's in it for European citizens?

Wednesday 27 June 2018 – 16:00-18:00 – P3C050, European Parliament, Brussels

Topics / issues:

- The economic output of Business Aviation
 - The industry acts as an enabler for regional and national economic development; the industry represents 374,000 European jobs; €87 billion in output, €32 billion in Gross Value Added, which equals the total GVA of Latvia, and €25 billion spent in salaries.
- The use of single engine turbine
 - What's the potential of that entry-level and versatile segment of business aviation following the European Aviation Safety Agency's recent approval of single-engine turboprop aircraft for commercial operations in Europe?
- Medical Flights
 - In the business aviation community each emergency is different, but in many cases, a business jet is the only means to save someone's life.
- Regional Connectivity
 - Business Aviation significantly improves connectivity over Europe. Study results show that Business Aviation in Europe serves 25,280 city pairs not connected by nonstop commercial flights; Of the 800,000 Business Aviation city pairs analysed, about 27% did not have nonstop commercial aviation service between them; and Time savings enabled by better connectivity were greater in Eastern Europe and in general in the continent's periphery.
