Today, Lindbergh is a co-founder of VerdeGo, designing engines for advanced air mobility vehicles, and leads the ForeverFlight initiative, advancing zero-carbon fuels.

The forward-looking spirit for EBACE Connect continues into a Day Two EBACE Connect Town Hall on 19 May, with the leaders of airframe OEMs sharing their perspectives on new business aviation clientele, the outlook for a post-COVID "new normal", advances in airframe and cabin technologies and more.

"Across the globe, business aviation is emerging from the pandemic stronger than ever," said NBAA President and CEO Ed Bolen. "At EBACE Connect, we have the perfect lineup of aviation leaders, including those who have made history, and are at work building toward the future.
